ANNUAL REPORT -2014

Highlights of the activities in the financial year 2014

- 1. Virgin Money Giving operated in full swing during 2014 thereby enable to receive the gift aid as well along with the contribution to our bank a/c after deducting their 3.5% commission.
- 2. An independent complete website www.bmcharity.org were able to construct and begin to run to the full accessibility for the public to view the day to day activities of BMCF.
- 3. The address of regd. office has been changed to 9 Meyrick Road, Wellington, Telford, Shropshire TF1 3EN.
- Some constitutional changes were made during the AGM to the designations of the office bearers as Chief Executive has been changed to Secretary and Finance Manager to Treasurer.
- 5. Cases were taken on a group basis including 1 or more beneficiaries by naming & identifying each appeals mainly with respective months.

Summary of Cases funded in the year 2014

BMCF were able to complete funding 21 individuals/institutions during this financial year. Raised \pounds 56058. and given away \pounds 51170.00 An amount of \pounds 746.00 was expenses.

Out of above total receipt, £ 29209.00 were raised through Virgin Money Giving which was directly credited into our bank a/c , most of them with gift aid collected at source and deducting 3.5% commission by Virgin Money Giving. Out of the total spending of £51170.00, an amount of £ 40170.00 were spent for funding surgeries/medical interventions in India, £ 5000.00 for repatriation support in U.K, given an amount of £ 3500.00 to support families in U.K and £ 2500.00 to charitable organisations in U.K such as Disaster Emergency Committee (DEC) & Diabetic UK.

A total amount of £ 746.00 incurred towards payment expenses such as auditors' fee £ 300.00), Virgin Money Giving regn. charges (£ 120.00), website developer's advance (£ 201.00) Year ending closing balance including previous year(£ 10037.00) is £ 14179.00

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Details of Projects/appeals undertaken during Jan-Dec 2014.

1. Aakash Appeal

A little boy of 7 years were benefitted from our charity for his treatment for 'haemophoelea' as he required an amount of Rs. 30,000/- (approx £ 300.00) per month for his regular medical follow-ups. An amount of £ 5165.00 was given to Master. Aakash from kuttippuram, Malappuram District of Kerala , India in January 2014. Aakash appeal started in the month of December 2013 and ended in January 2014 with the necessary funded handed over in the same month.

2. Ibrahim Appeal

The untimely demise of late Mr. Ibrahim from Blackpool. England on 30.12.13 was a real setback to his family by financially and emotionally. However, our charity was there to lend them a support by giving an amount of £ 3500.00, out of which, £ 2500.00 generated from our appeal and rest from the crisis (general) fund, in January 2014.

3. D. Sundaram Fund.

We were able to use our 'crisis fund (general fund)' wisely by disbursing an amount of £ 1000.00 to the family of deceased late Mr. Sundaram Velayudhan from Broomely, London for the repatriation purposes in Feb.2014. Mr. Sundaram died unexpectedly due the heart attack. It was a timely help for the bereaved family and a sharp reminder to us for the importance of having a 'crisis fund' to meet such an emergency situation.

4. T.J Joseph Appeal

In March 2014, an appeal run to raise the amount of £ 1555.00 were handed over to Prof. T.J Joseph, a well-known person and a victim of communal hatred as his both hands were cut-off by the vicious attacks of religious extremists in the events surrounded by an unwanted controversy over a 'question paper' prepared by him in the state of Kerala, India. Tragically, his wife late Mrs. Salomi Joseph also ended her life due to the extreme pressure and agony she was going through at that time as a result of above controversy and also because of termination of Prof. Joseph from his employment..

5. May Appeal

It was an exceptionally unforgettable event with his esteemed presence of Rev. Dr. Philipose Mar Chrysostum Mar Thoma Valiya Metropolitan, who handed over the funds of our 'May appeal' on 28.06.14 at Kozhencherry in Kerala, India with the assistance of Y'smen club. A total amount of £ 15000.00 were collected from this appeal run from 25th May to 7th June 2014. Cancer patients such as Mr.Thomas Mathew from Mylappra, Pathanamthitta district and Mrs.Jalaja from Mannuthi, Thrissur District were able to receive an amount of £ 3250.00 each and the same amount was also given to Mr.Shaji from Pattithanam, Ettumanoor, Kottayam District for his kidney treatment.

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It was a long dream of Mrs.Sridevi from Parampuzha, Kottayam District to have her own house and the same was materialized with the help of our £ 3250.00. However, an 11 year boy Master.Nikhil, a heart patient got an amount of £ 2000.00 in order to enable him to purchase a pace maker equipment for his heart condition.

6. July Appeal

An amount of £ 9250.00 were raised via 'July Appeal' and the same was distributed to the respective beneficiarys on 09.08.2014 at Kottayam, Kerala, India by the State Minister of Transport, Mr. Thiruvanchoor Radhakrishnan. The event was organized with the assistance of Indian Redcross Society, Kottayam branch. It was a memorable occasion wherein, two ill young boys were given an amount of each £ 2250.00. Master. Nidhin Paul, aged 15 hail from Edakkunnam in Ernakulam districtof Kerala State, India was suffering from 'chronic ostio malaities' and our help was a real relief for his further treatments. Similarly 14 year old Master. Ebel Abraham from Velloor, Kottayam district also benefitted from us for his treatment for a rare disease to his back bone. Also, we were able to assist Mr. Regimon from Chottanikkara with an amount of £. 1500.00 towards his heart condition. Whereas Mr. Mathew George from Pothanikkadu, Ernakulam district were able to receive an amount of £ 1000.00 for his Kidney disease (Protein leak). Eventhough Mr.Biju donated one of his kidneys to his better-half, Mrs. Shiby were looking for fund for her further treatment and we managed to give an amount of £ 2250.00 to the affected family.

7. 'Onam' Appeal.

'Onam' is a harvest festival associated with mythical King of 'Mahabali' and its being celebrated widely in the state of Kerala, India will all religions and communities together. The trustees had decided to celebrate this festival in a different way by helping the needy back in our home state.

Our 'Onam appeal' was particularly attracted the attention of U.K malayalees because of the peculiar nature of 4 cases and the same was whole-heartedly supported by the public. The condition of Master. Sivanand, a 3 year old tribal boy from Udayagiri, Alakkodu in Kannur district of Kerala, India who suffer from 'cerebral pulsy' were discussed with great sympathy and compassion amongst the readers of 'British Malayali' when it published their story through 'Onam appeal. The story of kindness and selfless dedication of Mrs. Mini teacher, who set an example to others by deciding to donate one of her kidneys to 27 year old Ms. Remya from Kottarakkara was also widely accepted and impressed to the general public. Also, our offer of assistance in the form of Rs. 3 lakhs (£ 2300 + Rs. 75000) were a great relief to the family of two small children i.e. 7 year old Master. Alan & 1 1/2 years old Miss. Alona from Muttom in Idukki district in fighting with their rare condition. Mr. V.K Narayanan from Vellappara in Pathanamathitta dist. were also one our recipients of above appeal and his pathetic and poor conditions both by disease and finance were greatly met with our support.



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The appeal was boosted by the donation of Rs. 3,00,000.00 by an esteemed businessperson & philanthropist based in London, which enabled us to provide an equal amount of Rs. 75000.00 to 4 each affected persons/families. He handed over this amount in India in Indian Rupees.

The appeal raised a total amount of £ 9200.00 from 'British malayali Charity foundation' supporters and a total amount of Indian Rs. 12 lakhs (£ 9200 + Rs. 3000.) were given to all four families. Each family received an amount of Rs. 3 lakhs (£ 2300 + Rs. 75000.00).

8. Biju Augustine Fund

Late Mr. Biju Augustine (41 years) from Manchester, England passed away on 8th of October as he was suffering from lukemia, who survived his wife Mrs. Wilfy Biju and two young children i.e. Mis..Neha & Master.Nevin. Our charity run an appeal for just two days in order to assist the family to repatriate the remains to his homeland back in Karthikapuram, Alakkodu in Kannur district, Kerala ,India. Along with the total collection of £ 3623.03 and the amount taken from the crisis fund (£ 376.97), required money of £ 4000.00 were handed over to Mrs. Wilfy Biju, widow of Biju by our Vice-President, Mr. K.D Shajimon at Manchester on 11.10.2014.

9. November Appeal

Mr.. Baiju George from Kothamangalam, Kerala, India was kind enough to return an amount of £ 2225.00 as the balance funds available with him from the proceeds given to him during the month of December 2012 (our 2nd appeal). We felt it is very important to continue to support the local charities in U.K and as a token of solidarity to them, we handed over an amount of £ 1250.00 each to well known U.K charities such as Diabetic UK and Disaster Emergency Committee (DEC). Balance amount of £ 275.00 raised through appeal

Over & above, an appeal known an 'Christmas appeal' run through the month of December 2014 and the collected fund were distributed in the month of January 2015. This will reflect in the Annual Report of January – December 2015.
